


The Gandhara Hindko Board Peshawar and Gandhara Hindko Academy Peshawar remain dedicated to the promotion and development of Hindko and other regional languages spoken in Pakistan. So far, Gandhara has published over 500 books and dictionaries in various languages. Additionally, the Board publishes 18 different magazines in multiple regional languages, one of which is "Kotal Rang". The latest issue of "Kotal Rang" has now been published, following the publication of several earlier editions. The magazine is edited by renowned educationist, researcher, and author of multiple books Ms. Nusrat Naseem. While the earlier issues of the magazine featured writings by authors from Kohat, the current and ninth issue centers around a recently published Hindko-language travelogue written by Nusrat Naseem herself. Other writers from Kohat have also contributed their reviews and reflections on this travelogue. The new issue of "Kotal Rang" brings together these reviews and the travel narrative, and consists of 34 pages. The next issue is planned to include poetry and articles by poets and writers from Kohat, showcasing the literary richness of the region.

## 10<sup>th</sup> Issue of "Sargi Da Tara" Magazine Published


#### Appreciation of Gandhara's Role in the Promotion of Regional Languages





#### Hindkowan Weekly Newspaper Completes Seven Successful Years

The Hindkowan weekly newspaper, published under the banner of the Gandhara Hindko Board Peshawar. has successfully completed Seven years of continuous publication, being the only weekly newspaper in the Hindko language. It was launched following the vision of Muhammad Zia Ud Din, General Secretary of the Gandhara Hindko Board Peshawar, who secured its official declaration and initiated its regular publication seven years ago. Over time, the readership of Hindkowan has grown significantly. The paper is now read widely from Khyber to Karachi and has published 364 successful issues to date. The newspaper reaches audiences across the globe through social media platforms like WhatsApp and Facebook. It enjoys a readership in the thousands, not only within Pakistan but also internationally, receiving

appreciation from Hindko-speaking communities in countries such as the United States, Canada, and Australiawhere readers remain deeply connected to their mother tongue despite being oceans away. Contributors to the newspaper include Muhammad Zia Ud Din. senior columnist and Gandhara Board permanent member Mr. Ateeg Siddigui, renowned columnist Dr. Inayatullah Faizi, Mansehra-based researcher and author Saeed Ashar, executive members of the Board Waseem Shahid Zia-ul-Haq Sarhadi, and Muhammad Akhtar Naeem President of the Board's Mansehra Branch. Their writings reflect a deep love for the Hindkowan newspaper and the Hindko language.

The Hindkowan weekly newspaper also holds the unique distinction of launching, for the first time in the history of the Hindko language, a

# Translation Work under Gandhara from and into Hindko and Other Languages



Under the auspices of the Gandhara Hindko Board Peshawar and the Gandhara Hindko Academy Peshawar, translation work is actively being carried out from various Pakistani languages to Hindko and from Hindko to other languages. In a statement, renowned Hindko research scholar and General Secretary of the Gandhara Hindko Board, Mr. Muhammad Zia Ud Din, emphasized that the Board has always given due importance to other languages alongside Hindko. As a result, translation efforts have been ongoing for several years. Notable accomplishments include the poetic translation of the Holy Quran into Hindko, the translation of Allama Igbal's Persian poetry, essays of Patras Bukhari, and Hindko poetry of Ahmed Ali Saaien to Urdu, Pashto, and English. Additionally, Volume 18 of the Linguistic Survey of India from Sindhi language has been translated into Hindko. Other works translated include poetry books of Mr. Ejaz Rahim (originally in English) to Hindko, Pashto, and Urdu; novels by Nazir Bhatti; stories from Kalila wa Dimna: Colonel Sir Robert Warburton's English book into Hindko; and translations of works by Munshi Premchand and Saadat Hasan Manto to Hindko
